MEET THE TEACHER

On Monday 25 September 2023, school will be open for parents to come into class with their child to visit the classroom, see where their child sits, look at their child's early work from this term and talk to the teacher. We will be open from 3.15pm until 5.00pm and parents can pop in at any time. This is not a formal staff - parent consultation about learning and progress; that will take place in December after our assessments have been done for the term. This is more of an opportunity to find out how your child is settling into class and learning in their new year group, and for us to share any problems that have arisen that we need to address. It also gives parents an opportunity to talk to the teacher about 'myths' about staff and practices that come up year after year that seem to wobble children.



SCHOOL UNIFORM

Just a reminder that Summer uniform can be worn until 1 October 2023.

From that date, Winter uniform applies as we move properly into Autumn and colder weather.

Gingham dresses, cardigans and shorts can be worn this month, but from October need to be packed away for another year.

Currently, the summer seems to be lingering and whilst that is the case, please ensure that your child has a hat in school (named, of course) for hot, sunnier days. We operate an 'no hat, no outside play' policy and it would be a shame for your child to have to play indoors when their friends are outside.

If your child does not have school shoes yet, please arrange to purchase these as a matter of priority.

NEW LOOK CLASS NEWSLETTERS

You should, by now, have received your first class newsletter of the year. You may notice a difference in the presentation of it this term. On the front of the newsletter are the day to day reminders, such as important dates for your child's class, reminder notices and information about what we will be teaching in English and Mathematics this term.

When we teach other subjects we try as far as possible (without becoming tenuous) to teach them in a way whereby we link knowledge from different subjects together. This way we build strong learning links that will enable knowledge to 'stick' in children's memories for future learning and use. For example, in geography we may learn about the weather patterns of a different country and compare these to the weather patterns in the UK. In learning this, we may produce mathematical graphs and charts. When interpreting this information we may record our ideas in writing which builds our English knowledge and skills. When we teach subjects in this way, we look at integrating them into one topic – climate, in this case – so at Langdon we call this our Integrated Learning lesson. Much of our English curriculum is woven into Integrated Learning lessons, providing a real opportunity for children to use the knowledge and skills they have been taught in reading and writing lessons.

On the back of the newsletter, you have a Knowledge Organiser. This document details key and essential information that we want your child to learn over the course of the Integrated Learning topic they are being taught. Teachers have outlined key facts about the topic; vocabulary that they will be using and definitions of this so that children really understand what we are talking about; interesting or unusual information that may be taught such as a quote that is associated with the topic or bit of more detailed information about an aspect of the topic that may be interesting to know. The Knowledge Organiser will also include diagrams, images, pictures and photographs for example, a country's flag, a flow diagram of a lifecycle or an artist's impression of a period in time. We encourage you and your child to really explore the Knowledge Organiser and to use it to support activities at home that enhance and enable learning. The children will be learning far more than the outline you receive, this is just the core information we want them to know and remember; but if you can help your child learn the key facts and vocabulary at home, then when they come to lessons in school they will understand more readily what the teacher is teaching them. Use the Knowledge Organiser to help your child explore their topic more widely either through books, the world wide web or other experiences such as visits to places that are relevant to the topic.

We will be assessing children's knowledge and understanding of their learning of course, as we progress through our planned teaching activities and the information on the Knowledge Organiser is our starting point for that assessment.

YEAR 3 - SCHOOL DINNER CHANGES

If your child has moved into Year 3 this September, you need to be aware that school dinners will no longer be provided free of charge under the Universal Infant Free School Meals for Key Stage One children. Meals <u>must</u> be ordered and paid for on SQuid <u>in advance</u> of them being taken each day. School dinners cost £2.44 per meal.

If your child is eligible for benefits related free school meals then their entitlement to free meals will continue as usual. If you think that you might be eligible for this support, then please apply. Pupil Premium funding that we use to help pay for our support adults in the classroom is based on our numbers of free school meals eligible children.
